We are grateful for our interactions with the Birds Australia English Names Committee, whose members responded to our questions and proposals and made recommendations where new or existing names required consideration in light of taxonomic changes. Our editors ensured that we remained focussed on completing this job, and rigorously edited the text, identifying inconsistencies and ambiguities, and providing utmost care in seeing this project through to completion. We are very grateful to all our colleagues who have helped us out. Any errors of fact or interpretation remaining are, of course, the responsibility of the authors. We are grateful to the Australian Museum and Museum Victoria for providing the facilities in order to undertake this project.
