Community gardens

There is a long European tradition of community gardens. Since the first in 1977, they have become increasingly popular across Australia. Each is run slightly differently, but generally the annual fees entitle members to a plot of about 15 m² although size varies. They are usually used to grow food. Australian City Farms and Community Gardens Network can help find the closest

community garden and provide advice on how to start one.

Progressively more schools have vegetable plots for students to learn about food gardening and to enjoy the produce. The programs are being initiated by keen teachers and/or parents, with increasing support from governments.

Street tree selection can include foodproducing species, the fruit being available for harvest by the nearby residents. The idea is not well developed in Australia, but there are some historic examples and some local councils promote fruit species in their lists of acceptable species.
